

TANZANIA NATIONAL PARKS RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Driving in the parks is allowed between 6 am and 6 pm only.
- Do not exceed 50km/h and no more than 25km/h in the Ngorongoro Crater.
- Camping is permitted only in designated sites.
- In the Ngorongoro Crater, picnicking is allowed only at designated sites.
- Wild animals always have the right of way.
- Keep to the authorized tracks only. You will be fined if you are found off the main tracks.
- Do not disturb or harass the wildlife in any way. Radios and cassette/CD players are forbidden. Please do not imitate animal's sounds, clap or pound on vehicle or hoot. Do not throw objects to attract animal's attention.
- Do not litter. Keep your waste in the vehicle until it can be properly disposed later at your lodge or camp. Litter can choke or poison animals and birds.
- Do not smoke while on game drive and always dispose cigarettes carefully while at camp. A burning cigarette can start a wild fire that would cause damage to vegetation and suffering to wildlife and people.
- Do not light or cause fire to be lit. If camping, be sure to extinguish your fire carefully.
- Never feed animals at your hotel or in the wild. It will upset their diet and lead to an unnecessary dependence on people.
- Do not pick, cut or destroy any vegetation or remove any object of biological interest, including eggs, bones and trophies.
- All visitors must remain in their vehicle within 200 meters of any game animal. Leaving the vehicle in the parks is forbidden except in designated places.
- Discourage your driver from approaching the animals too close (25 meters). Lions, cheetahs and leopards are especially nervous; a vehicle can hinder their hunting or make them leave a hard earned meal. Your driver may be banned from the area and/or lose his job.
- Domestic pets are forbidden in the parks.

Leave the park undisturbed by not leaving or removing anything, animate or inanimate

Payment of Park Fees:

TANAPA (Tanzania National Parks) payment is by credit card or designated TANAPA park fees cards only. MasterCard & Visa accepted at Arusha, Tarangire, Serengeti, Lake Manyara National Parks. TANAPA Cards are accepted at all gates – pre-paid cards are available at certain banks in Arusha.

NCAA (Ngorongoro Conservation Area Authority) no longer accept Cash, Visa, Master card or travelers cheques at the park entrance gates. For entry to the park you need to obtain Smart Cards.

Prior to departure, guests must pay in Cash both USD and Tanzanian Shillings park fees at CRDB bank in Arusha. Once payment is done you will receive a computerized slip as proof of payment. The computerized slips should be presented at the NCAA branch office in Karatu for certification. At this NCAA office they will provide you with Smart Cards which can then be used at the gate of NCAA.

WMA (Wildlife Management Area Fees) – This is a fee being collected at certain wildlife controlled areas outside the parks. To get across such areas you need to pre-arrange and pay for the entry permits in advance which is between \$15-\$20 per person/day and for the vehicle is approx \$4 per day. Please inform us your travel plans/programs for us to guide you on this and organize such permits in advance to avoid unnecessary inconveniences.

NB: The areas which require permits are Outside Tarangire National Park, Ikoma Game Controlled Areas, Loliondo Game Controlled Area, Lake Natron, Engaresero, Longido, Monduli, Simanjiro, Babati/Burunge, Rombo/Lake Chala, Karatu, Siha/Ndarakwai, Meatu, Mwiba Area, Maswa Game Reserve, Kiteto/Makame and several other areas which are still being allocated.
